NORTHERN SEA WOLF BEGINS DIRECT SEASONAL SERVICE BETWEEN PORT HARDY AND BELLA COOLA

Vessel sails direct one-way seasonal service five times a week until October 10, 2019

VICTORIA – BC Ferries celebrated with Central Coast communities today the Northern Sea Wolf's inaugural direct sailing from Bella Coola to Port Hardy. The seasonal direct service between Port Hardy and Bella Coola is a spectacular 10-hour journey through the Great Bear Rainforest. BC Ferries looks forward to welcoming tourists and local residents on board, and supporting tourism in the region with this truly unique travel experience.

On June 2, BC Ferries hosted a public open house on board the Northern Sea Wolf in Bella Coola, prior to the vessel's first direct sailing on June 3. BC Ferries invited members of the public on board to tour the ship, see the amenities and meet some of the crew. The vessel features a new galley, bridge, electrical generators, HVAC system, washrooms, elevator, chair lifts, new cafeteria and passenger accommodation area. It includes an outdoor passenger area on the top deck that provides customers with breathtaking views and is sure to be popular. BC Ferries is also holding a public open house in Port Hardy from 7 to 9 p.m. on June 3.

Kwakiutl First Nation's Richard Hunt and Nuxalk Nation's Danika Naccarella designed the artwork that adorns the Northern Sea Wolf. The artwork is displayed on the interior and exterior of the vessel for customers to view, and profiles of the artists are available onboard.

BC Ferries and community stakeholders named the Northern Sea Wolf in honour of a First Nations' legend in which the Sea Wolf is a manifestation of the Orca. The designs depict the beauty of the majestic animal, with the Sea Wolf the symbol of family, loyalty and the protector of those travelling their waters.

On May 3, the Northern Sea Wolf departed BC Ferries' refit facility in Richmond and arrived in Bella Coola the following day. The ship conducted sea trials and dock fits at the ports it serves and welcomed local residents on board for a tour at the same time. The dock fits were successful and on May 18, the Northern Sea Wolf took over from the Nimpkish to provide connector service for residents and visitors between Bella Bella, Shearwater, Ocean Falls and Bella Coola. Partial funding for the Northern Sea Wolf project was provided by the federal government through the Provincial – Territorial Infrastructure Component – National and Regional Projects.
