CELEBRATE CANADA'S BIRTHDAY WITH SMOOTH SAILING ON BC FERRIES BC Ferries offers travel tips for the popular Canada Day long weekend

VICTORIA – The Canada Day long weekend is coming up, and B.C. residents and visitors will travel to celebrate the country's birthday. BC Ferries wants the journey to be enjoyable, and is offering travel tips to ensure smooth sailing.

The most popular travel times are generally Thursday and Friday afternoon, as well as Saturday morning, with lots of travellers departing from Tsawwassen and Horseshoe Bay terminals. Historically, Canada Day Monday and the following Tuesday morning are popular times for people to return from Vancouver Island and the Sunshine Coast. To avoid sailing waits, BC Ferries recommends you reserve, or travel at less busy times. Canada Day Long Weekend Travel Tips

- Reserve in advance Reserve early to secure a spot on the sailing time of your choice.
 Customers with flexibility can travel at off-peak times to avoid the rush. Reserve online at <a href="https://docs.ncbi.nlm.ncbi
- Travel at off-peak times and get a deal The Sunrise and Sunset Savings promotion features savings on more than 1,600 early morning and late evening sailings. Select sailings are discounted to \$49, \$59 or \$69 for a one-way standard passenger vehicle and driver on the Tsawwassen Swartz Bay, Tsawwassen Duke Point and Horseshoe Bay Departure Bay routes. - Bring it all The Bring it All promotion offers an opportunity to save when travelling with an extra length recreational vehicle between May 16 and Sept. 4. Customers with vehicles longer than 20 feet (6.1 metres) will pay only \$3.25 per additional foot (regularly \$6.50) on select sailings on two of the routes between Metro Vancouver and Vancouver Island. More than 1,100 sailings are discounted on the Tsawwassen Swartz Bay and Tsawwassen Duke Point routes. Details of the promotion can be found at beferries.com/promotions.
- Check-in smoothly Follow traffic control flaggers and have your booking reference number ready upon arrival at the ticket booth to expedite the check-in process if you have made a reservation.

- Arrive early Customers with reservations should plan to arrive at the terminal 45-60 minutes before their scheduled departure. Walk-on passengers should arrive 45 minutes before their anticipated sailing.
- Be prepared for sailing waits At popular times, if you are travelling without a
 reservation, you may experience sailing waits. Check out the best times to travel on our
 <u>Travel Planning</u> pages at <u>bcferries.com</u>.

Did you know? On our reservable routes, a sailing wait only applies to people without reservations, when a vessel has reached capacity. Customers who make reservations are guaranteed to be on their sailing of choice. Reserved traffic moves smoothly. If a sailing wait occurs, it means that non-reserved traffic will be placed on the next available ferry. In the summertime, when sailings are hourly between Tsawwassen and Swartz Bay for example, a one-sailing wait can mean staying in the terminal for just an additional 60 minutes.

- Consider parking options Parking lots at the major terminals fill up quickly on long
 weekends. If possible, choose public transit or arrange to be dropped off at the terminal to
 avoid traffic congestion. When parking lots fill up, BC Ferries informs customers via Twitter
 @BCFerries and on the website.
- Ride-share, if possible BC Ferries encourages customers to car-pool or travel as a foot passenger. Vehicle deck space can fill up quickly and will be sold out at popular times.
- Celebrate Canada Day Enjoy entertainment at major terminals while waiting for the ferry. There will be face painting, bubble machines, mascots, kids music, magic and more. The Coastal Naturalists will be on site at varying times throughout the long weekend. The Stream of Dreams Murals Society will be at Tsawwassen and Horseshoe Bay terminals on Friday, June 28, and at Swartz Bay, Departure Bay and Duke Point terminals on Monday, July 1 to help kids paint wooden fish that will be installed along the terminal fences.
